A Passion for God Isaiah 64:1-9

This passage is about a passion for God. It is presented as a prayer. It is a prayer on the lips of Isaiah for the Israelites. We need to understand the context. The context is one of desperation. In the book of Isaiah, Isaiah prophesies how the Assyrians are going to overrun and destroy Israel, and also how the Babylonians are going to overrun Judah and carry them away into Exile. As a result of such suffering and hardship, the heart-cry we see in this passage was expressed.

This passage is a plea that the people of God would experience a fresh touch from God, which would leave them changed. But, it also shows why we do not experience the power and presence of God more than we do, despite the fact that He is working out His purposes in the world. If you have ever grown disheartened over the condition of the world, and you long to see an intervention from God, or if you have ever faced a crisis in your own life and desired God's intervention, you can certainly relate to this powerful prayer.

If you were to look back at 63:8-14, you would notice that Isaiah is recounting God's former acts in their behalf. We see moments in their history when God had intervened on behalf of His people. But since then, it was like God had withdrawn His presence. So, the petition is that God would take the veil and tear it like a piece of cloth, and God's presence and glory would shine brightly upon them again.

- 2. God is not asleep. He neither slumbers nor sleeps. *Psalm 121:1-8...*
- 3. God is Sovereign. *Romans 8:28.* God sees and knows. Because of His presence with us, there is never anything to fear.
